

School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).

### **Budget Overview for the 2023-24 School Year**




This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Cascade Union Elementary School District expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The text description for the above chart is as follows: The total revenue projected for Cascade Union Elementary School District is \$21,525,345, of which \$14184329 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), \$2762788 is other state funds, \$2094955 is local funds, and \$2483273 is federal funds. Of the \$14184329 in LCFF Funds, \$3191550 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

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The LCFF gives school districts more flexibility in deciding how to use state funds. In exchange, school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) that shows how they will use these funds to serve students.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much Cascade Union Elementary School District plans to spend for 2023-24. It shows how much of the total is tied to planned actions and services in the LCAP.

The text description of the above chart is as follows: Cascade Union Elementary School District plans to spend \$21779760 for the 2023-24 school year. Of that amount, \$7652052 is tied to actions/services in the LCAP and \$14,127,708 is not included in the LCAP. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the LCAP will be used for the following:


Regular instruction and operating expenditures, including maintenance and operations, core instruction, and administrative expense.

# Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in the LCAP for the 2023-24 School Year

In 2023-24, Cascade Union Elementary School District is projecting it will receive \$3191550 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students. Cascade Union Elementary School District must describe how it intends to increase or improve services for high needs students in the LCAP. Cascade Union Elementary School District plans to spend \$3216055 towards meeting this requirement, as described in the LCAP.
