

Capturing Kid's Hearts wants to help you acknowledge your child's achievement of goals, big and small. Helping your child develop perseverance now, will prepare them to learn from their future failures and to work hard to achieve future success. The 3 steps include activities to help families remember to work daily to learn new things and keep trying even when it is hard, to use a word to describe their best version of themselves and identify three actions to persevere and model that word, learn that daily commitment and patience are necessary to persevere like when tending a garden. The 3 steps include opportunities to teach our character trait of the month and model the power of perseverance!



Chez Bob, by Bob Shea



Ms. Ann dressed up as Chez Bob the very hungry but lazy alligator who builds a bird seed restaurant to entice birds to come in, planning on eating them. He soon becomes friends with them after they create a whole town based off his restaurant. Chez Bob decides he in fact can not eat them even after the perfect opportunity presents itself. Students reviewed cafeteria behavior and ate a croissant at a slow and polite pace while demonstrating nice table manners.

Negative Cat, by Sophie Blackall

After begging for a cat a young boy's parents finally give in. After picking out the cat of his dreams from the shelter, the cat (Max) isn't all he was hoping for. Max is a rather negative cat, until the young boy discovers Max loves to be read to. From then on Max and the young boy along with his class read to shelter cats. TESTING TIPS for PARENTS

- Make sure appointments are not scheduled during the testing time frame that would require students to arrive late or be picked up early.
- Make sure you child attends school regularly. Remember, tests do reflect children's overall achievement. The more effort and energy a child puts into learning, the more likely they will do well on tests.
- Make sure that your child is well rested on school days and especially the days of a test.
- Give your child a well-rounded diet. A healthy body leads to a healthy, active mind.
- Provide a good breakfast, including a protein.
- Encourage your student to do their best.

• At the beginning of the year Meadow Lane held an exciting RAFFLE for all 3rd through 5th grade students who participated in the Spring 2023 CAASPP state testing. Students were rewarded for showing improvement or maintaining proficiency on the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) test.

• Students were given tickets based on a score of 2 or higher, as well as tickets for showing improvement on their previous score. A schoolwide raffle drawing for testing grade levels, 3rd grade and higher was held.

• There were so many great prizes: Squishmallows, Wireless Headphones, Wireless Speaker, Lego Sets, gift cards to Amazon, Crumble Cookies and more. The grand prize was a 32" LED Television. All the students were happy for each other and the excitement could be felt by everyone.

• Meadow Lane will be holding raffles during CAASPP Testing, April 29th through May 17th. Students will earn raffle tickets for being on time to school, attendance, and their efforts. Please watch for more information to come as we near our testing window.

 The district will again be holding a RAFFLE to reward students for showing improvement or maintaining proficiency once CAASPP Spring 2024 scores are received. Our Director of Curriculum is already planning.











Capturing Kids' Hearts

Finish Strong

Give extra effort to make it through to the end.

This month we are challenging students to work hard and stay determined. We are partnering with you to acknowledge your child's achievement of goals- big and small! By helping your child develop perseverance now, you can prepare them to learn from their future failures and work hard to achieve future successes. This month, look for opportunities to teach and model the power of perseverance!



ENGAGE: Power of Yet

Ask each family member to write down a list of things they would like to learn to do but just haven't done yet. For example, "I haven't learned ______." Choose a few phrases from each family member and repeat these phrases, adding the word "yet" to the end. Remind your family that we must work daily to learn new things and keep trying even when it's hard.



EMPOWER: The Best Version of You

Ask each family member to think of a word that describes the best version of themselves or a word they would like to live out. It may be a word from their class or family Social Contract. (For example,, respectful, responsible, a good listener, etc.). After each member decides on one word, ask everyone to identify three actions they can take to persevere and model their word to ensure they become the best version of themselves. Have weekly check-ins to see how things are going.



EXCEL: Winning Over Weeds

This spring, plant a garden as a family. It can be big or small! Discuss the daily commitment needed to help this garden grow and the patience necessary as you wait for the final product. Weed this garden together and as you do, discuss how this garden is like many challenges in life. Perseverance helps us to win over weeds!

Conversation Starters

- What is something you're good at that took a lot of hard work and practice?
- What is something you're still learning to do in school that is difficult?
- Who is someone at school you feel comfortable asking for help from when you need it?


